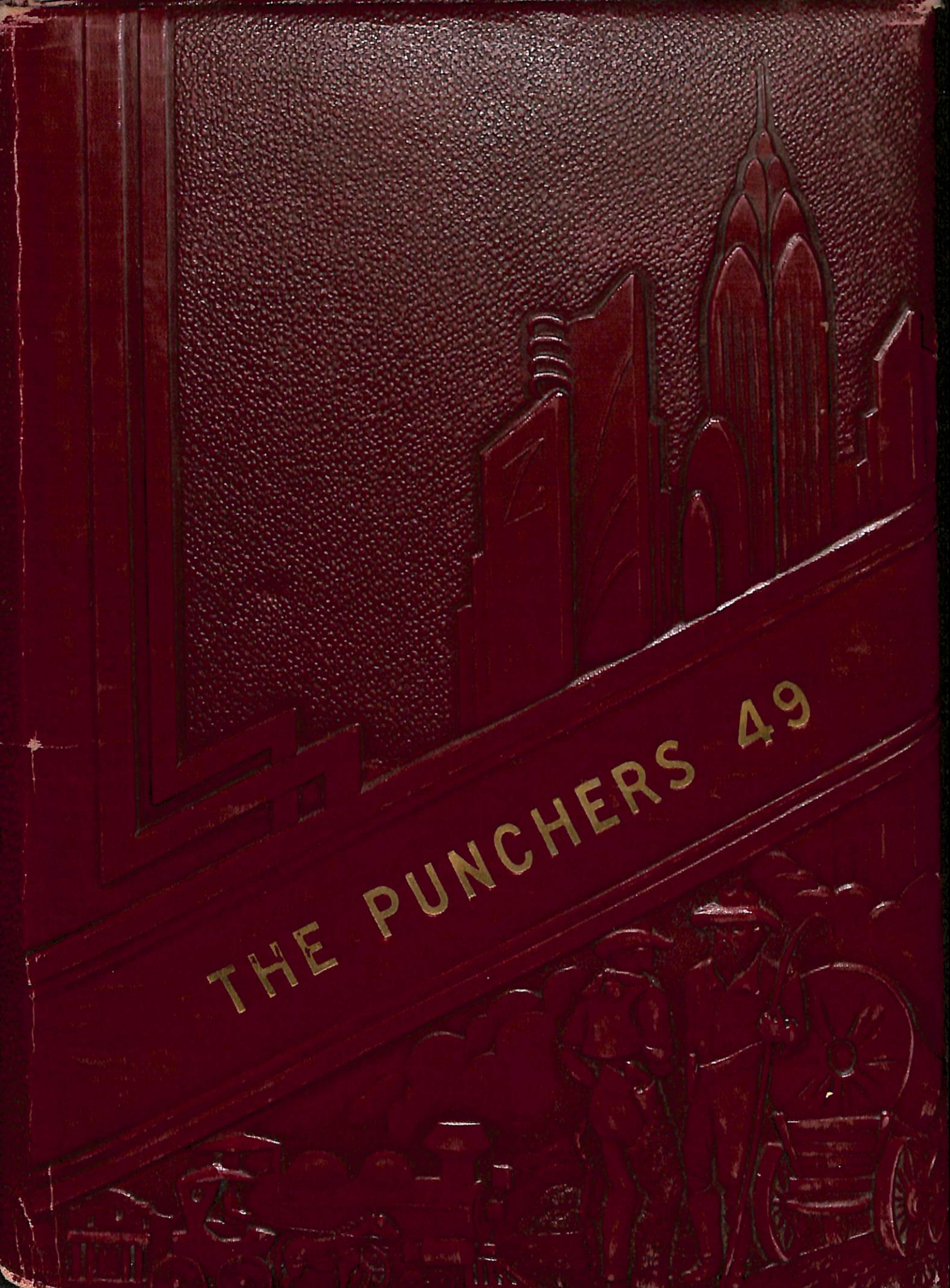

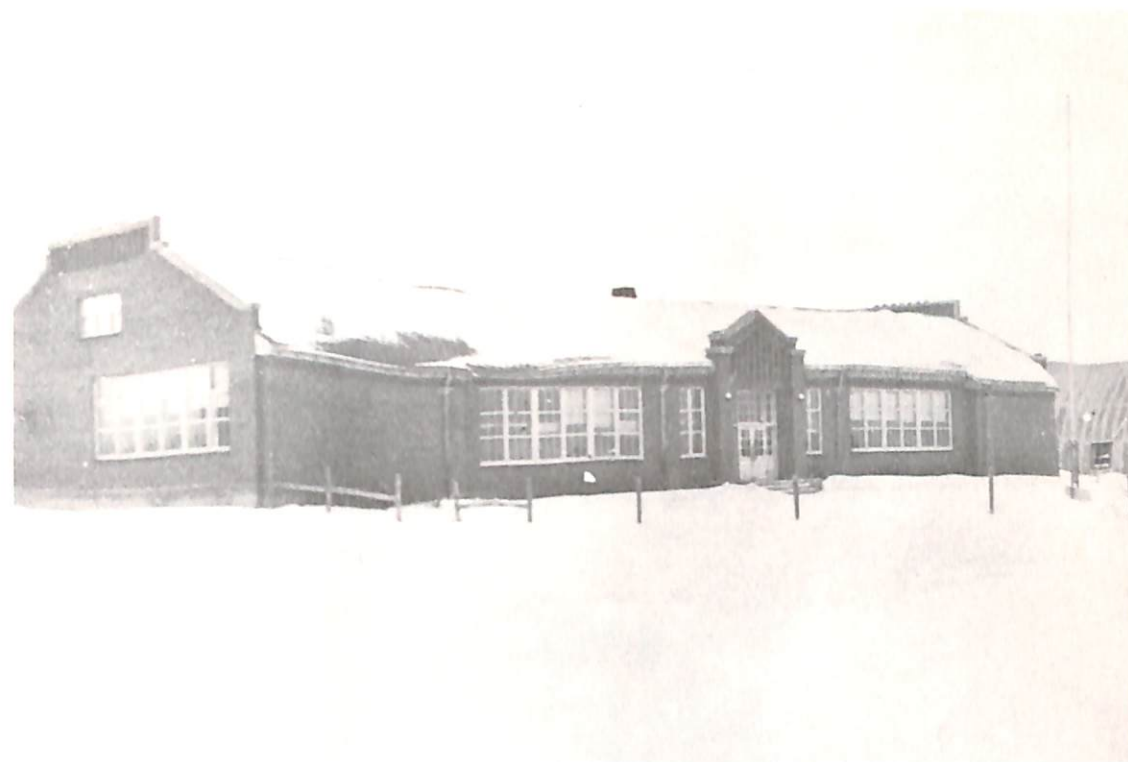

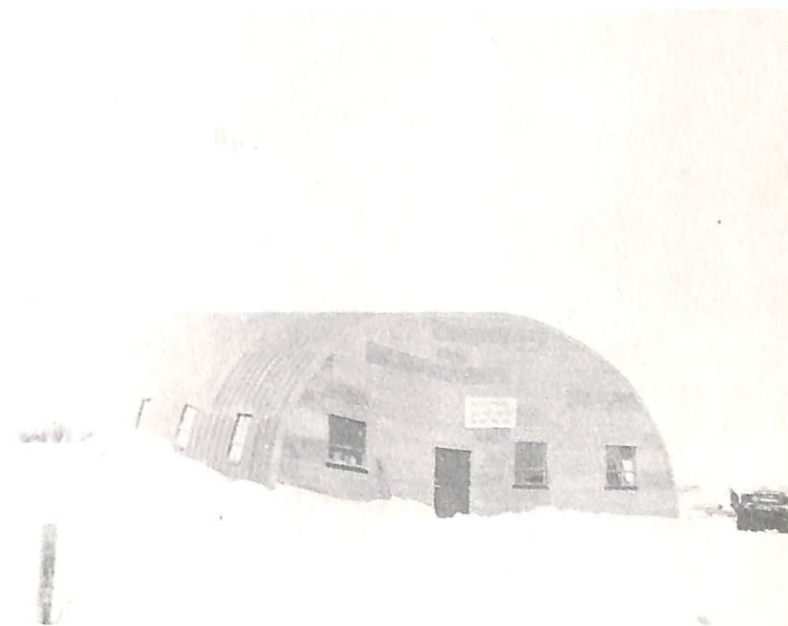

Superintendent's Message

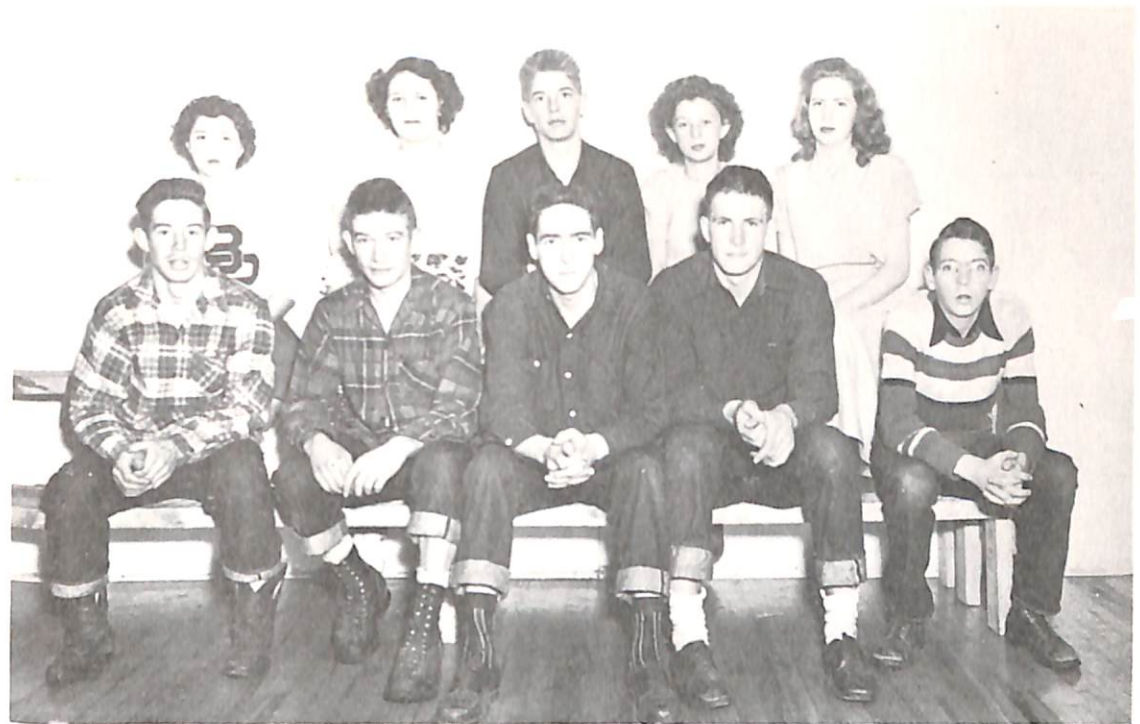
To the Students of Big Piney High School, my best wishes and greeting.
