Superintendent's Message



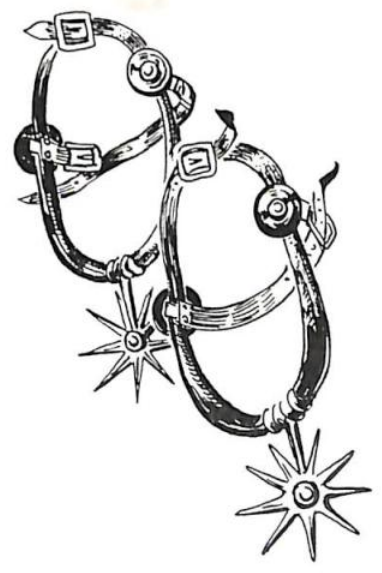
I wish to congratulate Miss Cooper and the Annual Staff upon the completion of this year book.

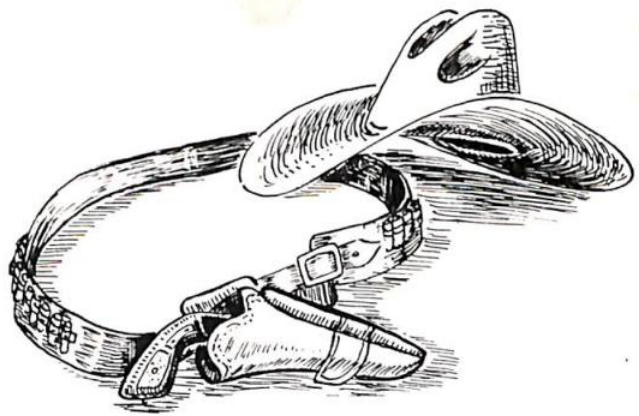
SENIOR CLASS PROPHECY

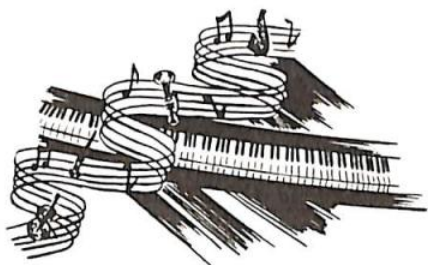


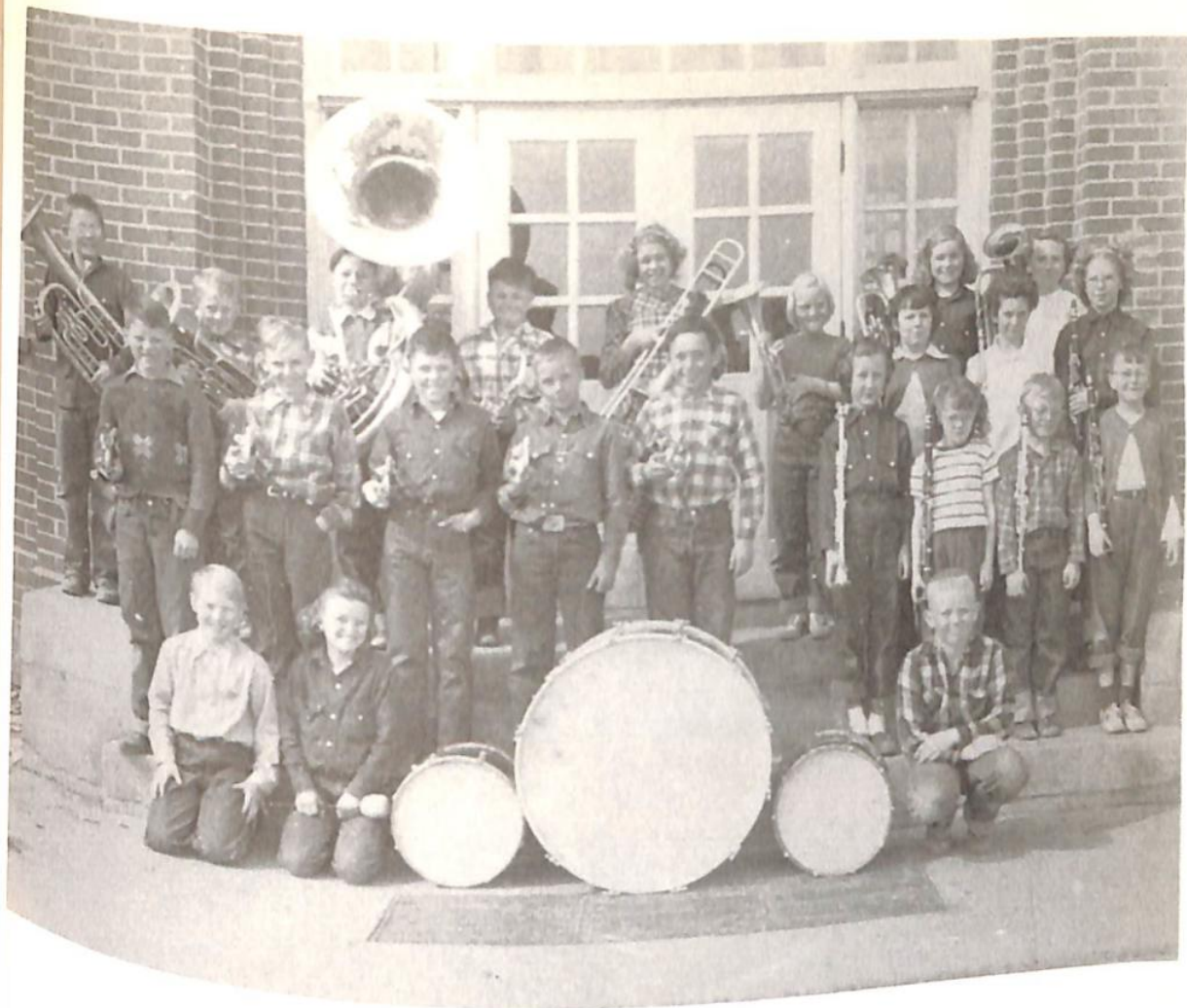
SENIOR BAND
