SENIOR BAND

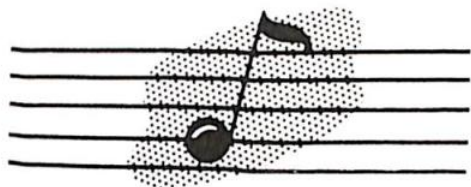
